

Duration: 3 hours per day (Total: 12 hours)

Goal: Introduce students to the fundamentals of screen printing, allowing them to design and create their own

Day 1: Introduction to Screen Printing & Basics

- Welcome & Icebreaker: Engage students with a fun creative activity.
- What is Screen Printing? Brief history, uses, and significance.
- <u>Materials & Tools:</u> Overview of screens, inks, squeegees, and substrates.
- <u>Design Basics</u>: Understanding stencils, negative space, and layers.
- <u>Hands-on Activity:</u> Simple stencil-making with paper or film.

Day 2: Preparing and Printing a Design

- <u>Fabric vs. Paper Printing:</u> Understanding different surfaces.
- <u>Hands-on Experimentation:</u> Students create multi-color prints.
- Group Reflection & Feedback: Discussion on challenges and successes.

Day 4: Final Projects & Showcasing Work

- <u>Independent Project:</u> Students create their own final prints.
- Finishing Touches: Drying, curing of prints.
- Show & Tell: Students present their designs.
- <u>Wrap-up:</u> Encouraging creativity beyond the workshop.
